Motivating Students to Progress at the A2/B1 levels

The *Cambridge English Examinations* at the A2 and B1 levels of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) allow pupils to demonstrate their increasing capability in English as they move toward becoming independent language users.

At the A2 level (*Key English Test*), pupils demonstrate basic understanding of instructions, are able to make simple requests, and can write simple letters on well-known topics. Achieving a certificate at this level can provide positive feedback and motivation for pupils to progress further.

As pupils advance to the B1 level (*Preliminary English Test and Business English Certificate Preliminary*), they are able to actively take part in conversations on known topics, read and understand newspapers and magazines, and write stories and longer letters. Demonstrating this intermediate level of ability can allow pupils better access to academic institutions and companies, as the B1 level shows that the pupil is able to function independently in English.
